Mañanitas– Sunday, December 12th, 6 am

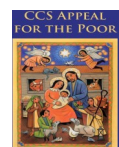


New Way Ministries Angel Tree

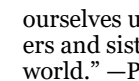

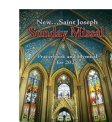
