**In Archdiocesan News:**

Archbishop Etienne has announced that with some precautions still in place, some normalcy can return back to the parish mass and life.

As of March 23rd, masks will not be required during mass. You are still welcome and encouraged to wear them if you’d like.

We will continue to have the front right pews sectioned off for those who wish to continue distancing at Mass.

We continue to encourage anyone who may have flu-like symptoms to choose wisely (stay home/wear a mask) if feeling sick to continue protecting ourselves and our community.

We will continue to have doors and windows open for proper ventilation.

El arzobispo Etienne ha anunciado que con algunas precauciones aún vigentes, se puede volver a la normalidad en la misa y la vida parroquial.
