St. Joseph / Peter Parish Annual Report

July 1, 2017 -- June 30, 2018

This past year was a good year for our parish. We welcomed our new Priest Administrator Rev. Francisco Cancino and two new staff members Bambi Hagan (Bookkeeper) and Angela Allen (Faith Formation Coordinator). We are very blessed by the large number of parishioners who give of their time, talent, and treasure to enable our parish to carry out Christ's mission.

Sacraments

St Joseph -We had 60 Baptisms, 1 Profession of Faith, 48 First Communions, 3 Marriages, 8 Funerals, about 300 Confessions, and about 50 Anointings.

St Peter – We had 3 Baptism, 5 First Communions, 1 Funeral

Welcoming

St Joseph -We welcomed many new families to our parish last year, for a total of 647 registered households and 1,967 individuals. Special events celebrated during the year included Our Lady of Guadalupe Celebration, Harvest Festival, Youth Convention, Children's Christmas program, Threshing Bee Food Booth, and the Holiday Craft Bazaar.

St Peter – We welcomed many new families to our parish las year for a total of 99 registered households and 242 individuals. Special Events celebrated during the year included Fall Fest to welcome Fr. Francisco, Children's Christmas program, and Easter Program.

Religious Education

St Joseph-There were 135 students, 19 adults, and 17 catechists/facilitators in our parish religious education program, from pre-school through 12th grade, RCIA and adult education.

St Peter - There were 54 students, and 11 catechists/facilitators in our parish religious education program, from pre-school through 12th grade,

Liturgy

St Joseph- Many people were involved in all aspects of our liturgical ministries: 57 Eucharistic ministers, 39 lectors, 28 altar servers, 15 ushers/greeters, 38 choir members/accompanists, and 12 sacristans.

St Peter - Many people were involved in all aspects of our liturgical ministries: 25 Eucharistic ministers, 6 lectors, 24 altar servers, 6 ushers/greeters, 10 choir members/accompanists, and 3 sacristans.

Along with Fr. Francisco they make our liturgies meaningful and spiritual.

Social Action Committees

St Joseph- Our parish Social Action Committee received \$1,110.00 in donations. Our donations included a \$400 Rice Bowl Grant for St. Joseph Social Action. With those funds we were able to assist many families with rent, utilities, food and help 24 transitional working families with food, toiletries, and diapers. We also had coat, sock, hat, and blanket drives. Our Social Actions also contribute to Tuesday Morning Friends, Interfaith Coalition, Christian Hope Association, and New Way Ministries.

St Peter - Our parish Social Action Committee received \$1366.27 in donations. We also had coat, sock, hat, and blanket drives. Social Actions also contribute to Tuesday Morning Friends, and Interfaith Coalition
